The purpose of this addendum is to provide the answers to questions submitted per solicitation Timeline **Section 2.4**.

- Q1) Why is the district utilizing a solicitation for the services requested in this bid?
- A1) A healthcare exemption was not approved for the period beginning on 01/01/2018.
- Q2) Can the district please explain how points will be awarded for the cost section of this solicitation?
- A2) See section 6.2 and 6.2.1 of the RFP.
- Q3) How many vendors does the district expect to award a contract to for the services requested in this solicitation?
- A3) See section 6.4 of the RFP.
- Q4) Can the district please provide incumbent information and current bill rates for contracts in place for similar services?
- A4) The Department pays under the 07/01/17-12/31/17 fixed-price contract a total amount not to exceed \$500,000.00, paid in five (5) equal monthly payments of \$83,333.33, and one (1) monthly payment of \$83,333.35, subject to the availability of funds.
- Q5) Can the district please describe the supplies and materials that the contractor will have access to at the district? (wifi, computer access, testing material, office supplies, etc.)?
- A5) The School Board of Miami-Dade County currently provides: first aid supplies and emergency equipment; disposable gloves; bandaging materials; adhesive tape; antiseptic cleaning solution; hand sanitizer; cotton balls; gauze squares; triangular bandages and splints; scissors; tweezers; pen light; safety glasses; red plastic bags for disposal of bio-hazardous waste; non-latex supplies for students and staff with latex sensitivities; access to technological wiring for the provision of school telehealth services



where available or, alternatively, allow the current provider to install technological wiring where feasible as determined by all parties; network connection with 3MBPS up/down speed and 15 amp dedicated circuit where feasible; SIS live access for electronic health records where available or, alternatively, allow current provider to install the connection where feasible as determined by all parties.

- Q6) What telehealth equipment is currently being used? Software?
- A6) To the best of our knowledge current provider uses: a portable suitcase, laptop, dermascope, otoscope, stethoscope, speaker/mic, sophisticated videoconferencing, diagnostics, web enabled devices, proprietary mobile applications with diagnostic instrumentation and interactive video capabilities, MCH Anywhere Telehealth Mobile Medical Station, Microsoft Word, Excel, and Outlook.

Q7) What was the total amount billed to the district for these services during the 2016-17 SY? **A7) \$1,000,000.00.**
